

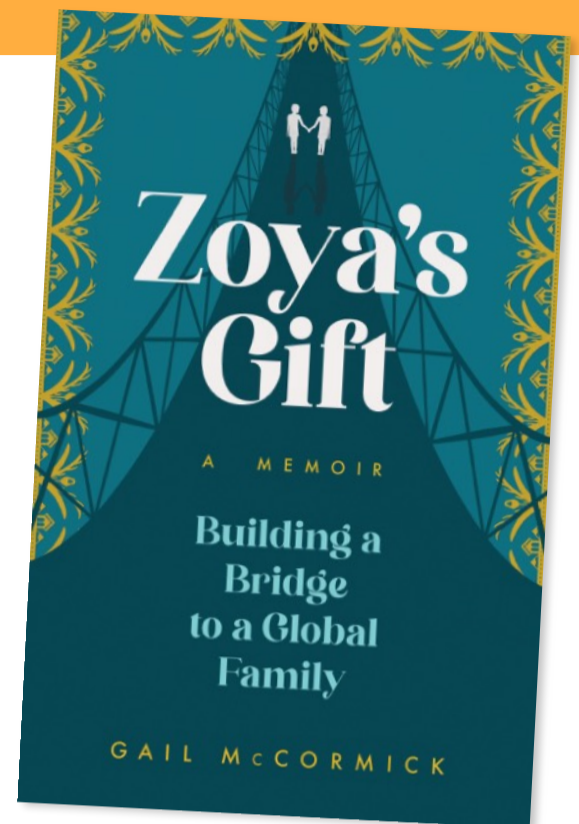
## Pacific Northwest Writers Association 2022 memoir competition finalist
